The RoSPA Occupational Health and Safety Awards 2010 are sponsored by NEBOSH (The National Board in Occupational Safety and Health), the leading health and safety professional examining body.

This year, three days of award ceremonies will be held in Birmingham from 11-13 May and gala dinners will be hosted by Lord Jordan of Bournville, RoSPA President, Lord Hunt of Wirral, RoSPA Vice-President and Lord Brougham and Vaux, RoSPA Vice-President, for representatives of award-winning organisations. An award ceremony will also take place in Glasgow in September.
