Three days of award ceremonies will be held at the Birmingham Hilton Metropole Hotel from May 12-14. Gala dinners will be hosted by Lord Jordan Bournville, RoSPA President, and Lord Brougham and Vaux, RoSPA Vice-President, for the representatives of award-winning organisations, with entertainment provided by comedian and impressionist Jon Culshaw.
